Kristin E. Hildebrant is a senior attorney at Disability Rights Ohio (DRO), Ohio's Protection and Advocacy Agency for people with disabilities. Kristin has practiced in the area of disability and special education law for 23 years and manages the special education unit at DRO.

In addition to her managerial responsibilities, Kristin represents children and parents in special education cases and represents individuals with disabilities in class-based litigation. Kristin is lead attorney in a state-wide class action involving Ohio's implementation of Medicaid's Early and Periodic, Screening, Diagnosis and Treatment (EPSDT) program for children. She is a frequent speaker on the topic of special education, juvenile justice and the school to prison pipeline and disability law.

Kristin received her law degree from The Ohio State University Moritz College of Law and is admitted to practice law in the United States District Court for both the Southern and Northern Districts of Ohio and the United States Court of Appeals for the 6th Circuit.
