Ball, Autism Society executive chair, has provided educational, employment, and residential services to children and adults who are affected with autism for more than 25 years. Myers provides personal insight and understanding to individuals like her with sensory processing disorders and ASD.

Medical professionals, including physicians, nurses, and physician assistants, can earn Continuing Medical Education (CME) in Medical Track sessions on Thursday, June 16. These educational workshops will increase the knowledge and skills that medical professionals use to provide services to patients with autism. The Medical Track was planned in accordance with the accreditation requirements and policies of the Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) through the joint providership of Case Western Reserve University School of Medicine and Milestones. Additional CME-approved sessions will take place on Friday, June 17.
